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**A BILL**

To repeal certain executive orders.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       This Act may be cited as the “Defending American  
5       Jobs and Affordable Energy Act of 2025”.

6       **SEC. 2. REPEAL OF EXECUTIVE ORDERS.**

7       (a) IN GENERAL.—Effective beginning on the date  
8       of enactment of this Act, the Executive Orders described  
9       in subsection (b) shall have no force or effect and no Fed-

1 eral funds may be used to implement, administer, enforce,  
2 or carry out those Executive Orders.

3 (b) EXECUTIVE ORDERS DESCRIBED.—The Execu-  
4 tive Orders referred to in subsection (a) are the following:

5 (1) Executive Order entitled “Unleashing  
6 American Energy” issued January 20, 2025.

7 (2) Executive Order entitled “Putting America  
8 First in International Environmental Agreements”  
9 issued January 20, 2025.

10 (3) Executive Order entitled “Declaring a Na-  
11 tional Energy Emergency” issued January 20, 2025.

12 (4) Executive Order entitled “Temporary With-  
13 drawal of All Areas on the Outer Continental Shelf  
14 from Offshore Wind Leasing and Review of the Fed-  
15 eral Government’s Leasing and Permitting Practices  
16 for Wind Projects” issued January 20, 2025.

17 **SEC. 3. SAVINGS PROVISION.**

18 Nothing in this Act shall be construed to impair any  
19 authority granted to the President.
